Alabama	800.656.3518		 In the event the Governor proclaims a state of emergency impacting any part of Alabama, Code of Alabama, 1975 Section 34-21-6 applies for the first thirty (30) days. An individual licensed to practice nursing in another state may provide emergency assistance in Alabama for up to thirty (30) days subject to verification of licensure in the state where licensed. Any organization or individual who provides employment or volunteer opportunities for the licensed nurse providing nursing services is responsible to ensure the validity of the nursing license. Should an emergency continue past thirty days, a temporary permit to practice nursing in Alabama for 90 days is required. A permanent application must be completed on-line and the nurse must apply for a Temporary Permit. Usually takes 2-3 weeks depending on time of year but applications are prioritized during a state emergency. If a nurse has an active license and will be in the state for less than 72 hours, he/she does not need a Connecticut license. 	Click here

Nevada			 Nevada does not have a specific Board rule for emergency licensing, but the Governor can call a state of emergency and override the Board requirements for licensure. The governor's office is the contact office during an emergency. Normal licensure can be processed for a temporary license in one week.

After seven days the emergency would then be elevated to the governor to decide whether he or she should declare a "state of emergency," which removes any licensing laws. In this circumstance, a nurse who has an active unencumbered license in another state does not require a temporary permit to respond and provide nursing care to individuals in Ohio during a declared disaster. Section 4723.32, ORC, establishes the circumstances in which an Ohio nursing license is exempted. Section 4723.32(G)(7), ORC, permits the activities of an individual who currently holds a license to practice nursing in another jurisdiction, if the individual's license has not been revoked, the individual is not currently under suspension or on probation, the individual does not represent the individual as being 		



			licensed under this chapter (does not represent him/herself a holding an Ohio nursing license), and one of the following is the case: o The individual is providing nursing care during any disaster, natural or otherwise, that has been officially declared to be a disaster by a public announcement issued by an appropriate federal, state, county or municipal official.

The governor may allow further extension for a declared state of emergency.

An online application request for a license by endorsement (permanent license) must be completed and an application for a Temporary Practice Permit must be made at the same time. The Temporary Practice Permit acts as a bridge while waiting for the permanent license. Only one Temporary Practice Permit per lifetime per license type (RN/LPN) may be issued. It takes approximately 10 business days for licensure by endorsement (permanent). 	Click here

Illinois			 Public Act 096-0516 Nursing Practice Act Illinois Board of Nursing does not have any specific rules regarding emergency licensure. If the governor declares an emergency, any nurse holding a valid license in another state can come into the state to work. There is no need to notify the Board of Nursing or get permission. The governor has the ability to override any state regulations during a declared emergency. This Act does not prohibit: The practice of nursing in Federal employment in the discharge of the employee's duties by a person who is employed by the United States government or any bureau, division or agency thereof and is a legally qualified and licensed nurse of another state or territory and not in conflict with Sections 50-50, 55-10, 60-10, and 70-5 of this Act. Nursing that is included in the program of study by students enrolled in programs of nursing or in current nursing practice update courses approved by the Illinois Board of Nursing. The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency. The practice of nursing by a nurse who holds an active license in another state when providing services to patients in Illinois during a bona fide emergency or in immediate preparation for or during interstate transit. 		



Kansas	RaeAnn Byrd 785.296.6573	 A nurse may be eligible for a non-renewable temporary permit, which permits employment as a LPN/RN in the state of Kansas while an application is being processed. A temporary permit is valid for 120 days or until the permanent license has been issued (whichever comes first). Prior to the issuance of a temporary permit, a completed endorsement application (and fee), criminal background check fingerprints/waivers (and \$48 fee), and proof of a current license in another state must be received by the Kansas State Board of Nursing for endorsement of applicants. It takes approximately six weeks for licensure to take place for an endorsement application, required for any nurse that is licensed in another state. There is no latitude in an emergency for temporary nursing privileges. Nursing licensure is by endorsement for RNs and LPNs and includes a criminal history background check. Applicants must: Request fingerprint cards by mail. Complete application in full, including: Fingerprint cards. Agreement for a criminal background check. Passport photos (2). Notarized affidavit. Copy of birth certificate or passport. Verifications from each of the nurse's previously licensed states. Time frame for processing depends on how long it takes to process the application and background check, get verifications, etc. Board of Nursing will try to expedite the process in an emergency.
